ENTERING THE NEW YEAR

UPON ENTERING

the new year and pondering what 2025 may hold for us at St. Mark's, it seems an appropriate time to offer an update about St. Mark's transitional process. Currently, a small group of Session members, called the Mission Study Team, is finalizing a written document which describes St. Mark's congregation, its ministries, and its vision for the future. The presbytery requires such a document from all churches experiencing

a pastoral transition.

The good news is that the Mission Study Team anticipates sending the final draft to the Session for its January meeting. The whole Session will then have the opportunity to read and edit the Mission Study report. Once the Session approves the Mission Study, it will then be sent to the Presbytery for its approval. And then, following the Presbytery's approval, St. Mark's will be given permission to elect and form a Pastor Nominating Committee for the purpose of calling an installed pastor.

A new group of guests were escorted from the border while we unload all of the coats, hats, and scarves.



SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

DECEMBER 2024 SESSION HIGHLIGHTS KERSTIN MILLER, CLERK OF SESSION

Session met on **December 3, 2024** for its monthly stated meeting.

<u>Clerk's Report and the Wider Church:</u>

- Kerstin highlighted the **2025 Per Capita Apportionment Letter** from Presbytery de Cristo. The 2025 **per capita amount** is \$43.84 of which \$28 go to the Presbytery, \$5 to the Synod of the Southwest and \$10.84 to the General Assembly. St. Mark's members and friends are asked to consider a rounded-up gift of **\$45**.
- The commissioners of the October 26 Presbytery meeting at Mountain Shadows Presbyterian Church (Rachael Eggebeen and Jim Cullum) reported that all the amendments to the proposed language changes of the Book of Order passed
- Beth Carroll and Kevin Hainline were elected as commissioners to the combined Presbytery meeting in Casa Grande on January 25, 2025.

Pastor's Report:

- Pastor Tracy Daub shared her list of activities and administrative meetings she
- attended between October 15 and December 2, 2024.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

Good Futures Team:

 The team is now awaiting proposals for a potential future use of Hudler Hall from two organizations, one that offers transitional housing for women and children and one that offers transitional housing for youth. Once these proposals have been received, the *Good Futures* group will bring a recommendation to Session.

Mission Study Team:

• Kevin Hainline reported that the group is putting the finishing touches on the Mission Study document and plans to present it to Session at the January meeting.

Ministry Team Highlights/Action Items:

Administration (Jeff Parrish and Charles Ambrose):

• Session unanimously approved a balanced budget for 2025 as presented by Irv Richards and the Administration Team. Session thanked Irv for his thorough preparation of the new budget.

Community & Global Engagement (Martha Osborne and Dexter Mitchell):

- Session unanimously approved covering the preschool tuition of a four year old child in the Casa Cardo Program seeking asylum in the United States. The tuition amount of \$2,394 will be taken from the For Others Fund.
- **\$1,160** were collected for the **Peace and Global Witness Offering**, of which \$290 went to Frontera de Cristo and \$870 to Presbytery de Cristo for Mission Partners.

Congregational Care (Becky Cook, Jim Cullum, Beth Carroll):

 No action items. Becky lifted up the wonderful card ministry run by Cathy Lurvey. In 2024 alone Cathy sent 160 cards to members of St. Mark's. Session very much appreciates this ministry.

Finally, Tracy thanked **outgoing Elders Sylvia Thorson-Smith, Jeff Parrish, Dexter Mitchell, and Kerstin Miller** for their service, presenting them with a waxed amaryllis bulb and emphasizing how much the congregation of St. Mark's has been blessed by their leadership.
