Genesis 45:3-11, 15 | New Revised Standard Version

Joseph said to his brothers, "I am Joseph. Is my father still alive?" But his brothers could not answer him, so dismayed were they at his presence. Then Joseph said to his brothers, "Come closer to me." And they came closer. He said, "I am your brother, Joseph, whom you sold into Egypt. ARE YOU ENJOYING THE HYMNS THIS MONTH? Then consider saying "thank you" with your donations. In celebration of Black History Month, worship at St. Mark's during the month of February will highlight the wide array of African American spirituals found in our hymnal. These songs are beautiful and rich in theological and spiritual meaning. Yet, as the composers of these songs were enslaved peoples, neither they nor their descendants received any royalties for their creative endeavors.

In response to this generational injustice, St. Mark's offers our worshipping community the opportunity to make a small gesture toward "royalty reparations." Each Sunday in February, a donation basket will be located in the narthex of the sanctuary for worshippers to express their gratitude for the spiritual songs that continue to enrich our faith today. Donations can also be made through the Vanco and Venmo QR codes in the worship guide. Please indicate that your donation is for the Dunbar Pavilion. At the end of the month, these donations will then be sent to the Dunbar Pavilion—an African American arts and culture center here in Tucson. Originally, the Dunbar Pavilion was the home to the only segregated school in Tucson for African American children.

ISKASHITAA REFUGEE NETWORK: There is currently a great need for some basic food and household supplies. St. Mark's Community and Global Engagement team is launching a drive to collect specific staple foods, though the end of March. Here are what they are requesting: flour, sugar, salt, rice, cooking oil, dish soap, toilet paper, diapers, female hygiene protection. PER CAPITA: Per Capita costs connect Presbyterian Church (USA) congregations, presbyteries, and synods, with the work of the wider church. It's the primary source of funding for the Office of the General Assembly, it is how Presbyterian mutually and equitably share the cost of moving the church forward. There are two nights for the live shows: Friday February 28 at 6:30 PM is our friends and family night, and Saturday March 1 is reserved as the AZPM night. In the fast pace of today's culture, we often hear, "I can't find time to pray." Or, "I never really learned how to pray." 623 I've Got Peace like a River



In the King James Version, the promise of "peace like a river" is twice mentioned in Isaiah (48:18; 66:12) as a blessing that comes from doing God's will. The water imagery of this African American spiritual also provides reminders of Christians' baptismal identity.

I Want Jesus to Walk with Me 775



The two equal phrases in each line suggest that this African American spiritual shares some characteristics of work or field songs that were used to coordinate the efforts of slaves involved in tasks (road clearing, ditch digging, etc.) that needed combined rhythmic strokes.

728 Somebody's Knocking at Your Door



The description of the Son of Man as standing at the door and knocking (Revelation 3:20) has given rise to many visual and verbal representations of that figure. This African American spiritual uses its repeated phrases to imitate knocking and to give immediacy to this encounter.
